

BURROWS LANE FARM SHOW RULES

- Whilst every care is taken, BLF Show takes no responsibility or liability for any accident or injury caused to horses, ponies or competitors/spectators or any property whatsoever. We would ask all competitors/spectators to conduct themselves in a way not to cause any incidents.
- The decision of the judge on the day, in all classes, will be final.
- Competitors must be correctly dressed in all classes. Correctly fitted current BS riding hats must be worn at all times. PAS 015 will only be acceptable for the 2017 season.
- The excessive use of whips is forbidden. Whips must not exceed 30". The excessive use of spurs is forbidden, spurs must be blunt and turned down they must not be turned in. The age limit for wearing spurs is 15 and no spurs are allowed at all in the Junior Novice events
- Cantering anywhere on the show ground, except in the practice field or rings, is prohibited. Any rider found jumping in a ring not in use will be eliminated from classes in which they are competing. No other jumps, except the practice jumps, may be used.
- Any competitor arguing or disputing any Judge, Steward or any other competitors will be debarred from taking part in any further classes in that day's programme.
- Well behaved adequately tacked Stallions and Colts are allowed on the field to compete in appropriate classes. All stallions must wear Stallion ID Discs in the ring (these can be collected from the secretary's office) and be competently ridden or handled. Minimum age of handler 14 years.
- Late entries will not be taken once the list of competitors has left the Secretary's office, (Exceptions at the Secretary's discretion and an extra fee may be charged).
- Horse/Pony rider combination may vary from rules if permission is granted by secretary.
- First aid fees are compulsory.
- Entry fees will not be refunded under any circumstances.
- All rings will begin promptly at times stated and will run on unless announced prior, please listen to announcements, although we have tried to eliminate the chance of clashes this will all depend on class numbers and on some occasions a class may have to start and proceed without waiting and it is up to said judge if late competitors can enter.
- Show names must be kept the same for the entire season. If there is a name change mid-way through the season of either horse/pony or rider then a new set of points will be started.
- All disciplines are ran in conjunction with main ruling of their affiliated representative organisation. I.e. Show Jumping - BSJA Showing - BSPS
- Competitors are forbidden to re mount if a fall occurs in any ring.
- Members must enter the same class four times within a season to be eligible for end of season trophies. Please note Pre Season show is a non-points show.
- It is competitors' responsibility to ensure they enter the correct qualifying classes and collect the correct paper work on the day of qualification.

- All annual trophies must be returned before the last club show of current season, in the same condition they were awarded, failure to do so will result in a fee being charged to replace a like for like trophy.
- Any persons objecting to the height of a pony must do so in writing, along with a fee of £20, which will be forfeited if the pony objected to has, or gains, within one month, a Life Height or appropriate Certificate. If the objection is upheld, any prize won or points gained by that pony will be forfeited. If a person does not wish to produce a valid certificate they may have their pony/horse measured on the show ground by Miss Leanne Ryan, with a neutral witness being present with the owner. The decision being final.
- Any person wishing to make a complaint must do so in writing within twenty minutes of the incident, and accompanied by the sum of £10.00 to Miss Leanne Ryan.
- Any competitor may be expelled from the show ground, who has wilfully disobeyed any rules, or who has, in the opinion of any member of the committee, been guilty of any conduct derogatory to the character or prejudicial to the interests of the show.
- No horses will be permitted on the show ground if they have come from any premises that have had strangles, unless the yard has been free from strangles for at least 4 weeks. Any Horse or Pony showing any signs of ill health or poor condition will be removed from show ground.
- Show fields are used for grazing please use litter bins provided.
- Do not tie horses to fencing.
- Show ground opens 1 hour before the first scheduled class starts and closes 1.5 hours after the last class of the day ends.
- Please keep dogs on lead at all times, and remove any dog dirt in a safe and proper manner.
